

WE ARE TO THANK GOD FOR EVERYTHING

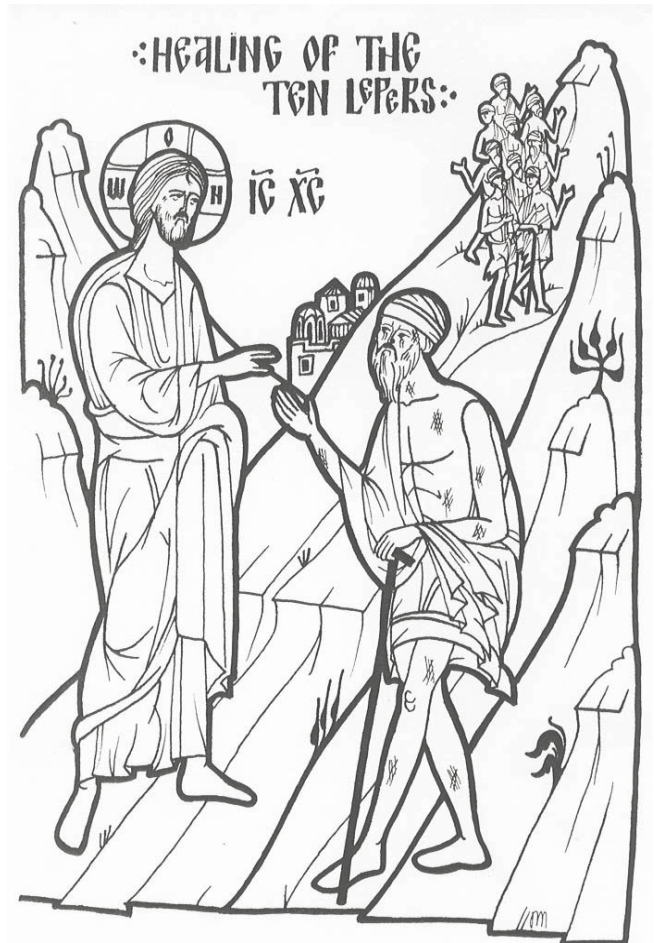

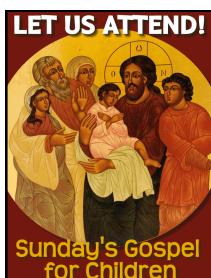

5. One came back to Jesus. Why?



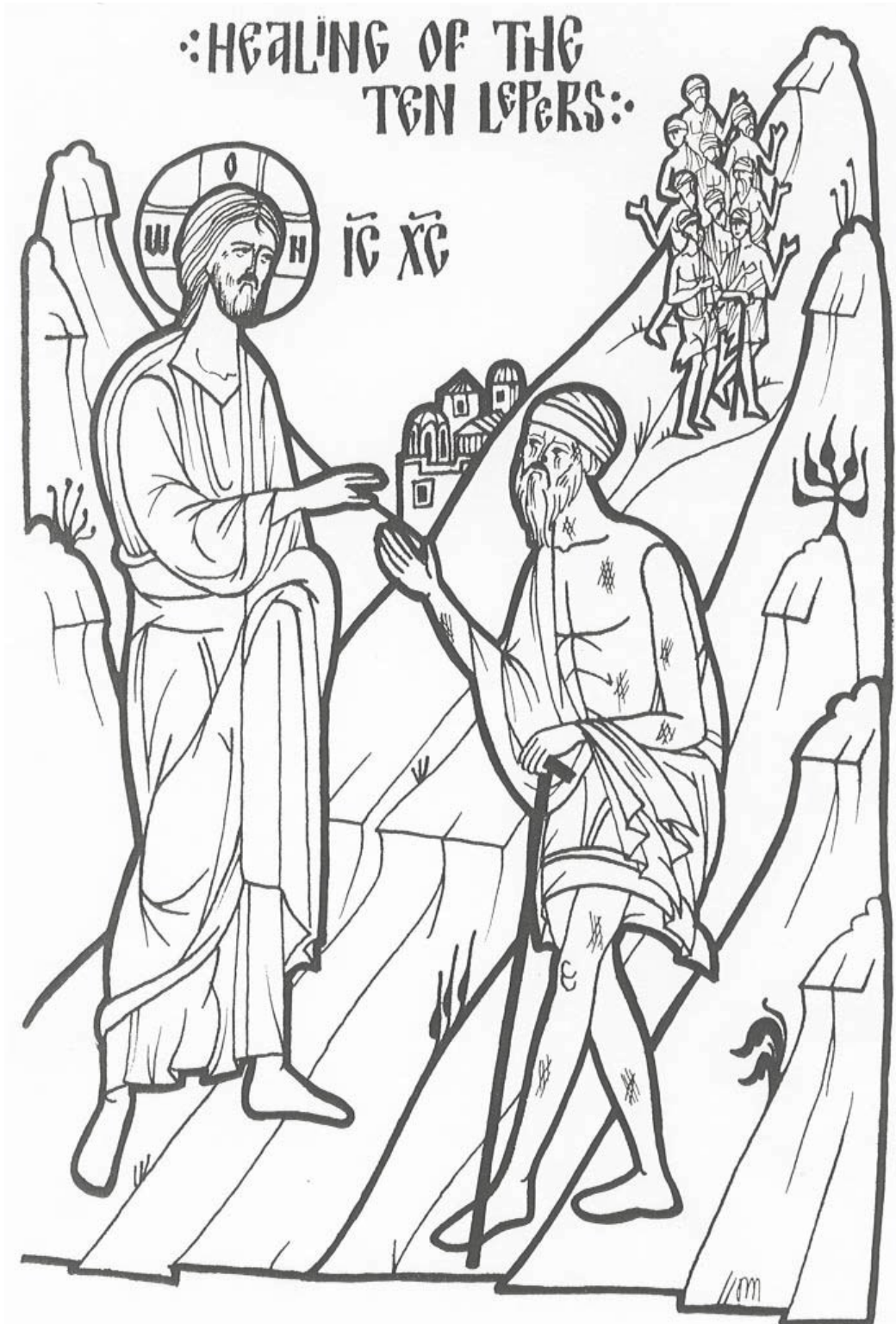

WE ARE TO THANK GOD FOR EVERYTHING

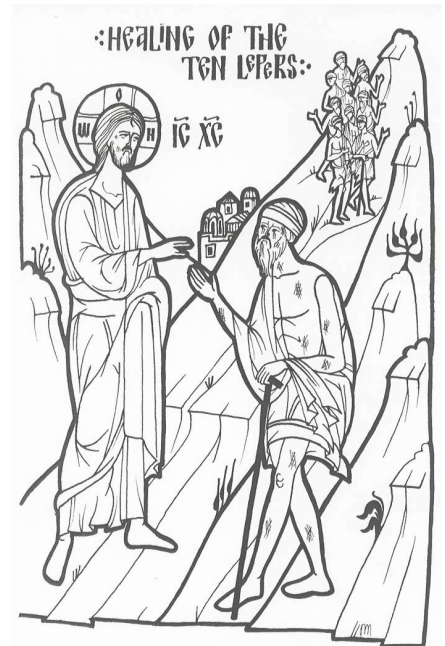
