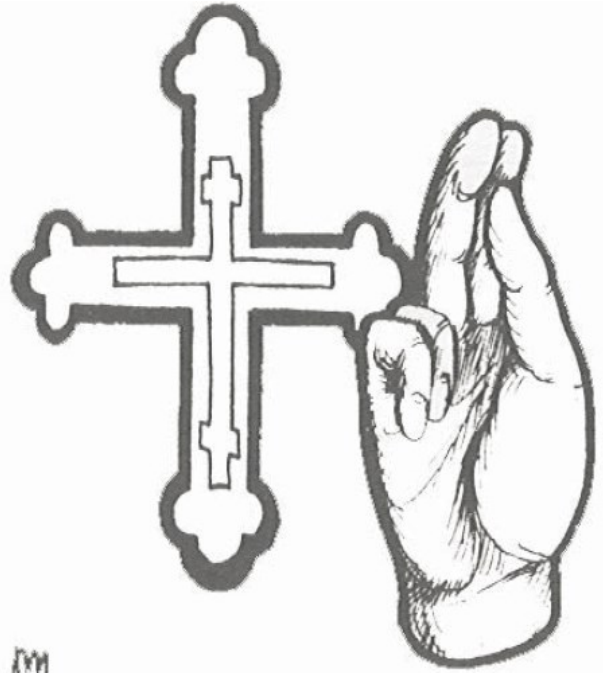


JESUS IS OUR LEADER

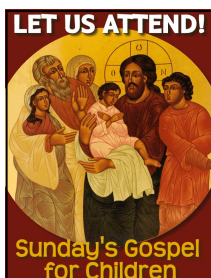
Then He promised that some of his followers would live to see God's Kingdom come with power!
