They took pieces of the roof off, and then lowered their friend down in front of Jesus. They so wanted him healed, and they believed Jesus would do just that.

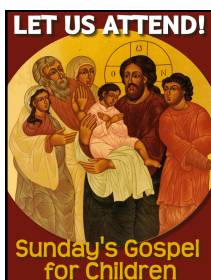

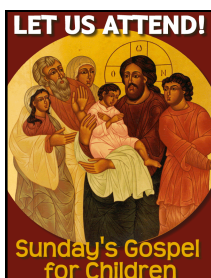
The man who could not move got right up, picked up his mat, and walked out of that house! Everyone who saw the miracle was amazed and praised God. They said, "We never saw anything like this!"

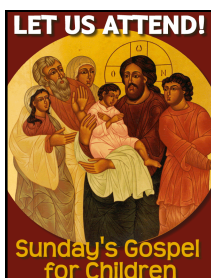

Narrator: he said to the paralytic,

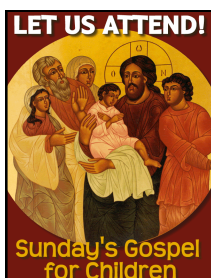
Jesus: I say to you, rise, take up your pallet and go home.

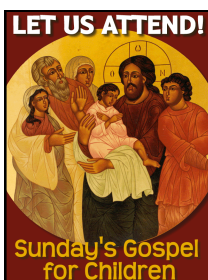

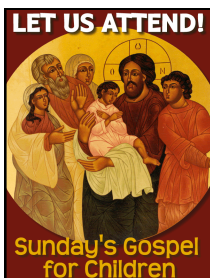
